# UChicago Faculty-Led Programs

Take the UChicago experience abroad and learn from UChicago faculty in a totally new environment. You will:

- Retain eligibility for financial aid
- Receive full or partial room and board as part of the program fee
- Receive full academic credit

## Civilizations Programs (23)

Fulfill your year-long civilization studies requirement in a single quarter. Courses are taught primarily by University of Chicago faculty and carry no language prerequisite, other than for the civilization sequences taught in French and Spanish. You also study a local language.

### Summer International Travel Grants

Summer International Travel Grants give you the freedom to design your own summer experience abroad. Travel independently to a location of your choice and carry out original research or study the local language. Each year the College awards approximately 100 grants of \$5,000 each to support these efforts.

#### Foreign Language Acquisition Grants

Pursue intermediate or advanced language study in the location and program of your choosing. Programs must be at least eight weeks long and located in a setting where the target language is predominantly spoken.

#### International Research Grants

Conduct independent research in all corners of the world, from field archaeology in Peru to molecular dynamics in Sweden. Often this work leads to a BA paper.

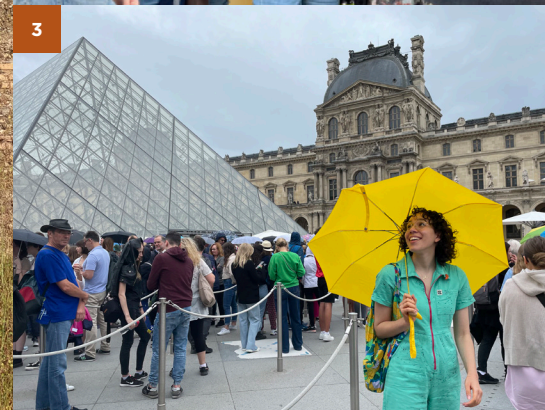
